FACULTY OF RADIOLOGISTS/ AMERSHAM: RESEARCH GRANTS 2008.

Applications are invited for Research Grants up to a value of €10,000 (maximum) from the Faculty of Radiologists, RCSI / GE/Amersham research fund. Any radiology trainee working in an approved Specialist Registrar post in Ireland is eligible to submit an application. A collaborative SpR team approach to foster a departmental research interest and establish a departmental research line will attract higher funding awards and be an advantage. A brief outline as to how the funding is to be utilised will also determine the size of the award.

The date for final receipt of Applications is **Wednesday 7th May 2008 at 4pm**. Late applications will not be considered.

Short-listing will take place and the proposed interview date is set to be on **Wednesday am 14th May 2008**. A member of the application group must be available to attend, be it SpR or consultant supervisor.

Applicants must submit an electronic version of the application and one printed and signed version with copies of up to 6 key references. The printed version should be sent to the Faculty office by the closing date. Electronic submissions should be sent to radiology@rcsi.ie

Successful applicants must agree to the following terms:

1. An Annual Report will be written. This will be due by the closing date of the grant application cycle each year until the project has been completed.
2. The completed project will be presented at the Faculty ASM or Spring Meeting.
3. The Faculty of Radiologists / GE/Amersham Grant funding will be acknowledged on all relevant publications and presentation.
4. The entitlement to draw down grant money terminates 2 years after the date of the grant award.
5. This grant will not be used to fund investigators travel to meetings.
